Why Environmental Footprint methods?

- **2010:** proliferation of labels: threat to Single Market
 - request from major industry players
 - Council conclusions: single method



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We need information that is **reproducible**, **comparable**, and **verifiable** : **Environmental Footprint methods**



What are those PEF/OEF methods?

- *PEF:* One guide to calculate the environmental footprint of products

- OEF: One guide to calculate the environmental footprint of organizations



Each over a 200 pages... with detailed modelling and calculation rules....

What is a PEFCR and OEFSR?

Product Environmental Footprint Category Rules:

A guidance, build further on PEF, with product group specific rules.

<u>Organisation Environmental Footprint Sector rules</u>: A guidance, build further on OEF, with sector specific rules.

Developed by a Technical Secretariat representing more that 51% of the European consumption market.

Pilot phase: 23 PEFCR/OEFSR (2013-2018)

Finalised in April 2018

 - Decorative paints
- IT equipment
- Leather

Commission

- Starts in January 2020
- Will meet 4x a year
- Co-chaired with ADEME
- Expression of interest for participation: Nov-December 2019
- Draft mandate finalised
- Draft mandate discussed at next TAB



Data development

• Working group on data (format, update procedures, ...)

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- EF datasets tendered during the pilot phase (incl. feed) => updated by May 2020
- New EF dataset tendering (incl. agricultural products): for new PEFCRs => by Nov 2020
- New database structure

Some conclusions

- Numerical values and scientific terms too complicated -> graphics, bars, colour schemes more easy to understand
- Clarity and simplicity is a challenge, but key
- Recommendations on how to use the product appreciated
- Negative statements are powerful
- Certification from named and independent sources
- QR codes and barcodes are a good mean to more detailed information for the interested citizen.



Follow-up study - communication

Test combinations of promising elements (get attention, be understood, influence purchases; BtoC)

With a PEFCR:

- Single performance score
- Performance in percentage respectively to the average
- Performance on the three most relevant impact categories
- Percentage contribution of life cycle stages to the total
- Additional environmental information
- Statements





Without a PEFCR:

- Percentage of improvement of a product over time
- Percentage contribution of life cycle stages to the total
- Qualitative claims (e.g. we reduce impact on climate change by using cutting edge energy saving technologies)
- Results
- Stated as based on PEF or not

Always there

- 3rd party verification
- QR code leading to detailed results
